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

The Gallup-Purdue Index, a national survey of more than 30,000 graduates from all types of colleges and universities, found that **how** students went to college had the greatest impact on their long-term success in college and life. Specifically, students who did these six things were far more likely to take advantage of opportunities as undergraduates and find success after graduation.

1. **Make connections** with faculty and staff members. At Bowling Green, we are eager to help you be successful.
2. **Be curious.** Here, you will have opportunities to learn about many things, and your Life Design coach will be there to equip you with the tools to discover what's available.
3. **Pursue your dreams.** Bowling Green is a comprehensive university with an incredible range of experiences and opportunities. Don't sell yourself short on what you can accomplish. Dream big, set goals and be bold.
4. **Engage in a long-term project** – one that spans at least a semester – where you can apply what you're learning in your courses to something personally meaningful. Here, Life Design can support you in making these connections and following through from start to finish.

Designed as a choose-your-own-adventure event, today is all about exploration and connection. No appointments or pressure, just opportunities to learn and ask questions. Use this program to build a day that's as unique as you.

Choose presentations wisely. Review the presentation schedule on pages 6-7 and select a few you'd like to attend. With so much happening, you may run into a scheduling conflict – or find a session is full. Good news: All presenters will also host tables in the exhibitor area. If you can't attend a presentation, stop by their table to ask questions and get the information you need.

Don't miss special activities. Some academic and student service areas are hosting special activities just for Presidents Day Open House. You'll find these on pages 12–23. These experiences are a great way to explore campus and connect with faculty, staff and students.

Plan the rest of your day around the special activities you're most excited about. If you don't see an area listed, visit their table in the exhibitor area.

Visit the exhibitor area. The exhibitor area is open from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Bowen-Thompson Student Union Ballroom. Between presentations and activities, stop by the exhibitor area to connect with academic programs, Student Financial Aid, the Office of Student Housing, club sports and more. A full list of exhibitors is on pages 8-9.

Campus tours and residence hall visits are separate experiences. Plan time for both if they are important to you.

Campus tours:

Campus tours run continuously from 10 a.m. until the last tour departs at 2 p.m.

Two options are available:

- 60-minute full tour
- 30-minute express tour

Tours leave from the second floor of University Hall (marked on the map on pages 30-31). Let staff know which tour you'd like when you arrive.

Residence Hall tours:

First-year residence halls are open for self-guided tours from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Use the residence hall guide on pages 24-25 and the campus map to decide where to go.

Residence halls are a very popular stop today, plan extra time in case there's a short wait to see a showroom (especially in Centennial and McDonald halls).

Take the next step. Admissions staff will be available in the exhibitor area until 3 p.m. Here, seniors can:

- Apply for admission
- Create a MyBGSU account
- Submit a housing payment
- Make an orientation reservation

Make yourself at home

- Shuttles and charter buses are available for transportation around campus (see map on pages 30-31).
- Enjoy lunch at one of our dining halls (locations hours and discount information on page 28).
- Visit Falcon Outfitters for BG gear. Show your program at checkout for special discounts (details on page 28).

Ready to tell the world you're a Falcon? Seniors who submit their housing payment or make their orientation reservation today (or who made it earlier) can pick up an exclusive 2026 flag in the exhibitor area.

Ask questions and settle in. We're so glad you're here! This event is all about you and your college search. Ask questions as you connect with faculty, staff and students throughout the day.

Need help? Stop by the Presidents Day information tables in the exhibitor area of the Bowen-Thompson Student Union. Staff will be available until 3 p.m. to help you navigate the schedule, choose activities, get directions and answer questions. You'll also see volunteers throughout campus – don't hesitate to ask!

TOP 5 TIPS FOR A GREAT DAY

1. **Build your own schedule.** Pick the presentations, tours and activities that matter most to you and design a day that fits your interests and priorities.
2. **Plan with the map in mind.** Activities take place all over campus. Check locations in the program and use the campus map on pages 30-31 to plan an efficient route between stops.
3. **Expect crowds and plan extra time.** Presidents Day Open House is our largest visit day of the year. Some sessions may fill, and there may be short waits for tours, residence halls and dining. A little flexibility goes a long way.
4. **Use the exhibitor area as your backup plan.** If a presentation is full or overlaps with another activity, stop by the exhibitor area to talk one-on-one with faculty, staff and campus partners.
5. **Ask for help and make yourself at home.** Volunteers and staff are everywhere and happy to help with directions, recommendations or questions. This day is all about you.

All presentations are 30 minutes long and will be held in the Bowen-Thompson Student Union or Olscamp Hall.

Both buildings are marked on the map on pages 30-31. Space is limited in the presentation rooms. If a presentation fills, please check the schedule for an alternative presentation time or visit the presenter at their table in the exhibitor area.







BGSU Main Route Shuttles

Board these orange BGSU shuttles at any stop noted on the map with this icon. These shuttles run all day and are available to current students and Presidents Day guests.



BGSU Technology Engineering Innovation Center, Kokosing Hall and BG Flight Center Shuttle

Board this orange BGSU shuttle in Lot 7C, outside the Bowen-Thompson Student Union (BTSU) parking lot for direct transportation between the BTSU, Technology Engineering Innovation Center, Kokosing Hall and BG Flight Center. Stops are noted on the map with this icon.
