Designed to be a "choose-your-own-adventure" event, you'll find a wide range of activities to build a day that's as unique as you are – this is your visit, your way!

HERE ARE A FEW TIPS TO GET THE MOST OUT OF YOUR VISIT TODAY:

- 1.** **Activities will be hosted in buildings all over campus today.** Be sure to note the locations listed throughout the program and refer to the campus map on pages 12-13. **Tip:** If you need help finding your way, just ask. Campus is in full swing today, and everyone is happy to help point you in the right direction.
- 2.** Review the **presentation schedule** on pages 4-5. Plan the rest of your visit around the presentations you'd like to attend.
- 3.** Head to the **exhibitor area in between presentations to connect with academic areas, Student Financial Aid, Residence Life, Club Sports and more.** You'll see the full list of exhibitors on pages 6-7. This area will be open in the Bowen-Thompson Student Union Ballroom until 3 p.m.
- 4.** **Make your way to the special activities hosted by some of our academic and student service areas.** This is a great way to explore campus and connect with faculty, staff and students. You'll find these activities on pages 8-9. **Tip:** If you don't see an area noted on this list, stop by their table in the exhibitor area.

- 5.** **If this is your first visit to BGSU, join a campus tour** to hear from a current BGSU student and explore our recreation center, student union and a few academic spaces. A one-hour walking tour of campus will be available from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. (the last tour will be sent out at 3 p.m.) Tours depart from the second floor of University Hall.
Note: Residence hall tours are not included on the general campus tour.
- 6.** **Take a peek inside some of our first-year residence halls.** While the residence halls are not featured on the general campus tour, most of our first-year residence halls are open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. for self-guided tours. We've included a guide to the residence halls on page 11 so you can decide which ones you'd like to visit. You'll find the residence halls marked on the campus map on pages 12-13, too.
- 7.** **Take the next step! Admissions staff will be available in the exhibitor area until 3 p.m.** Seniors – you can apply to BGSU, submit your housing payment or make your orientation reservation while you're here on campus.
- 8.** **Ready to tell the world you're a Falcon?** Seniors who submit their housing payment or make their orientation reservation at the event (or before!) can pick up a **FREE Class of 2027 flag** in the exhibitor area.
- 9.** **Ask questions.** We're all so glad you're here and are ready to help! This event is all about you and your college search – don't be afraid to ask questions as you're meeting faculty, staff and students today.
- 10.** **Make yourself at home.** *Free shuttle service is available* until 3:30 p.m. at any campus shuttle stop. Refer to the map on pages 12-13 for shuttle stop locations. You're welcome to hop on the shuttles to get around campus. *Enjoy lunch at one of our dining halls.* Check page 10 for locations and hours. *Stock up on BG gear at Falcon Outfitters.* Show the cashier your program at check-out for a special discount on BGSU apparel at Falcon Outfitters.
- 11.** **We're expecting a large turnout at the event today.** With many guests on campus, it's important to keep in mind that presentations may fill, the dining halls may be busy or there may be a short wait to join a campus tour or explore a residence hall. Please know the BGSU community is ready to ensure this is a great visit for you and your family.
