

	CENTENNIAL HALL \$\$\$ S D T P AC
	This is the most competitive first-year residence hall. If you didn't make your initial housing payment on Nov. 15, you may want to skip this tour. There are 600 beds available and we had over 1,000 people pay the day it opened.
	CONKLIN HALL \$\$ D C AC
	Conklin is a close-knit community and is only available to new students. It's a great choice for students who have classes in the Fine Arts Center or like to find a quiet place to study in the library because these buildings are across the street.
	KOHL HALL \$ D C LC
	A great hall for students interested in world culture, becoming future leaders and business majors because of the five learning communities who call Kohl home. You don't have to be a member to live here, but you will be missing out!
	KREISCHER HALL \$ D C LC
	Love music or art? You could find your home here in one of the two learning communities. It is also a great option for students who like to work out and attend sporting events, and student athletes because the stadiums and the Rec Center will be your neighbors. It is also the only hall with a full-service dining facility in the building.
	WEST CAMPUS RESIDENCE HALLS
	MCDONALD HALL \$ S D C LC
	Home to six learning communities for students in ROTC and aviation programs, education/education focused majors and students interested in exploring the BIG questions in life. You don't have to be a member of one of these communities to live here, but we recommend you check them out!
	OFFENHAUER TOWERS \$\$ S D T C LC AC
	With the math and science buildings across the street, this is a great location for STEM majors. If you want to guarantee a room in this building, we recommend checking out one of the four learning communities who call Offenhauer home.
	FOUNDERS HALL \$\$ S D P LC AC
	Founders Hall is only available to new students who want to live in the Honors Learning Community or in All Gender Housing. Both of these options require an application and approval. We recommend touring this hall only if you are interested in one of these two options. Open for tours from NOON – 3 p.m. only. See page 15 to learn more about the Honors Open House happening in Founders during this time.
